### **Confession of Sin**

**Leader and People (together):** Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

**Leader:** Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us all our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep us in eternal life. *Amen.*

### **Today's Appointed Psalm and Lessons**

Psalm 59 Eripe me de inimicis (responsively)

- 1 Rescue me from my enemies, O God; \* protect me from those who rise up against me.
- 2 Rescue me from evildoers \* and save me from those who thirst for my blood.
- 3 See how they lie in wait for my life, how the mighty gather together against me; \* not for any offense or fault of mine, O Lord.
- 4 Not because of any guilt of mine \* they run and prepare themselves for battle.
- 5 Rouse yourself, come to my side, and see; \* for you, Lord God of hosts, are Israel's God.
- 6 Awake, and punish all the ungodly; \* show no mercy to those who are faithless and evil.
- 7 They go to and fro in the evening: \* they snarl like dogs and run about the city.
- 8 Behold, they boast with their mouths, and taunts are on their lips; \* "For who," they say, "will hear us?"
- 9 But you, O Lord, you laugh at them; \* you laugh all the ungodly to scorn.
- 10 My eyes are fixed on you, O my Strength; \* for you, O God, are my stronghold.
- 11 My merciful God comes to meet me; \* God will let me look in triumph on my enemies.
- 12 Slay them, O God, lest my people forget; \* send them reeling by your might and put them down, O Lord our shield.
- 13 For the sins of their mouths, for the words of their lips, for the cursing and lies that they utter, \* let them be caught in their pride.
- 14 Make an end of them in your wrath; \*make an end of them, and they shall be no more.
- 15 Let everyone know that God rules in Jacob, \* and to the ends of the earth.
- 16 They go to and fro in the evening; \* they snarl like dogs and run about the city.
- 17 They forage for food, \* and if they are not filled, they howl.
- 18 For my part, I will sing of your strength; \* I will celebrate your love in the morning;
- 19 For you have become my stronghold, \* a refuge in the day of my trouble.
- 20 To you, O my Strength, will I sing; \* for you, O God, are my stronghold and my merciful God.

# The First Lesson: A Reading from the book of Sirach 31:12-18, 31:25-32; 2 (Nakieta)

- <sup>12</sup> Are you seated at the table of the great?\* Do not be greedy at it, and do not say, 'How much food there is here!' <sup>13</sup> Remember that a greedy eye is a bad thing. What has been created more greedy than the eye? Therefore it sheds tears for any reason. <sup>14</sup> Do not reach out your hand for everything you see, and do not crowd your neighbour\* at the dish. <sup>15</sup> Judge your neighbour's feelings by your own, and in every matter be thoughtful. <sup>16</sup> Eat what is set before you like a well-bred person,\* and do not chew greedily, or you will give offence. <sup>17</sup> Be the first to stop, as befits good manners, and do not be insatiable, or you will give offence. <sup>18</sup> If you are seated among many others, do not help yourself\* before they do.
- <sup>25</sup> Do not try to prove your strength by wine-drinking, for wine has destroyed many. <sup>26</sup> As the furnace tests the work of the smith, <sup>\*</sup> so wine tests hearts when the insolent quarrel. <sup>27</sup> Wine is very life to human beings if taken in moderation. What is life to one who is without wine? It has been created to make people happy. <sup>28</sup> Wine drunk at the proper time and in moderation is rejoicing of heart and gladness of soul. <sup>29</sup> Wine drunk to excess leads to bitterness of spirit, to quarrels and stumbling. <sup>30</sup> Drunkenness increases the anger of a fool to his own hurt, reducing his strength and adding wounds. <sup>31</sup> Do not reprove your neighbour at a banquet of wine, and do not despise him in his merrymaking; speak no word of reproach to him, and do not distress him by making demands of him.
- 32If they make you master of the feast, do not exalt yourself; be among them as one of their number. Take care of them first and then sit down; <sup>2</sup> when you have fulfilled all your duties, take your place, so that you may be merry along with them and receive a garland for your excellent leadership.

# The Second Lesson: A Reading from the Book of Revelation 12:7-17 (Edwina)

- 7 And war broke out in heaven; Michael and his angels fought against the dragon. The dragon and his angels fought back, <sup>8</sup>but they were defeated, and there was no longer any place for them in heaven. <sup>9</sup>The great dragon was thrown down, that ancient serpent, who is called the Devil and Satan, the deceiver of the whole world—he was thrown down to the earth, and his angels were thrown down with him.
- 10 Then I heard a loud voice in heaven, proclaiming, 'Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God and the authority of his Messiah,\* for the accuser of our comrades\* has been thrown down, who accuses them day and night before our God. <sup>11</sup> But they have conquered him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, for they did not cling to life even in the face of death. <sup>12</sup> Rejoice then, you heavens and those who dwell in them!

But woe to the earth and the sea, for the devil has come down to you with great wrath, because he knows that his time is short!'

13 So when the dragon saw that he had been thrown down to the earth, he pursued\* the woman who had given birth to the male child. <sup>14</sup>But the woman was given the two wings of the great eagle, so that she could fly from the serpent into the wilderness, to her place where she is nourished for a time, and times, and half a time. <sup>15</sup>Then from his mouth the serpent poured water like a river after the woman, to sweep her away with the flood. <sup>16</sup>But the earth came to the help of the woman; it opened its mouth and swallowed the river that the dragon had poured from his mouth. <sup>17</sup>Then the dragon was angry with the woman, and went off to make war on the rest of her children, those who keep the commandments of God and hold the testimony of Jesus.

# A Reading from the Gospel of Luke 11:53-12;12 (Esabel)

- 53 When he went outside, the scribes and the Pharisees began to be very hostile towards him and to cross-examine him about many things, <sup>54</sup>lying in wait for him, to catch him in something he might say.
- 12Meanwhile, when the crowd gathered in thousands, so that they trampled on one another, he began to speak first to his disciples, 'Beware of the yeast of the Pharisees, that is, their hypocrisy. <sup>2</sup>Nothing is covered up that will not be uncovered, and nothing secret that will not become known. <sup>3</sup>Therefore whatever you have said in the dark will be heard in the light, and what you have whispered behind closed doors will be proclaimed from the housetops.
- 4 'I tell you, my friends, do not fear those who kill the body, and after that can do nothing more. <sup>5</sup>But I will warn you whom to fear: fear him who, after he has killed, has authority to cast into hell. Yes, I tell you, fear him! Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies? Yet not one of them is forgotten in God's sight. But even the hairs of your head are all counted. Do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows.
- 8 'And I tell you, everyone who acknowledges me before others, the Son of Man also will acknowledge before the angels of God; <sup>9</sup>but whoever denies me before others will be denied before the angels of God. <sup>10</sup>And everyone who speaks a word against the Son of Man will be forgiven; but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven. <sup>11</sup>When they bring you before the synagogues, the rulers, and the authorities, do not worry about how<sup>\*</sup> you are to defend yourselves or what you are to say; <sup>12</sup>for the Holy Spirit will teach you at that very hour what you ought to say.'
